Songs of Thanksgiving

September 8, 2022 will be one of those dates we remember in history: what were you doing when you heard the news of Queen Elizabeth's death? Lynn and I were driving along Strandherd Road when Lynn got a message from her sister (who lives in the States!) about the passing of Queen Elizabeth II. Certainly it is the end of an era.

In 1959, on the 50th anniversary of our founding, the College was granted the privilege of adding "Royal" to its name, becoming the Royal Canadian College of Organists. Like most Canadians, Queen Elizabeth had been our only monarch. That is why, at any of our conventions, the programme book always includes a letter from our Governor General.

Regardless of your opinion on Canada and the monarch, as church musicians, we can all agree that the music for Her Majesty's various Services of Remembrance, funeral and committal were well chosen and executed. The local service, at Christ Church Cathedral, naturally had a truly Canadian element to it. Of course, there will be a coronation at some point and it, too, will be an occasion for great music.

Though Thanksgiving has been officially celebrated as an annual holiday in Canada since 1879, the date varied by year and was not fixed until 1957 when Governor General Vincent Massey issued a proclamation stating: "A Day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest with which Canada has been blessed – is to be observed on the second Monday in October".

Approval may be granted on the basis that this **extraordinary** event would be of specific interest to our members: e.g., church/choral, and/or organ/bells, and/or the encouragement of young organists and pianists.

3. If a non-member wishes to announce an event of his/her organization in Around Town free of charge, he/she must make a written request to the RCCO Centre Executive for approval of that one specific event. Approval may be granted per Policy 2; in most circumstances, however, we would expect the Organization to pay as per the rates set out by the Centre for advertising.
