Ours is an Easter Faith

In John's Easter Gospel we hear that, three days after the crucifixion, Mary Magdalene is searching for the body of her "Rabbouni (teacher)," her Jesus. We find her weeping as she discovers that the stone guarding Jesus' tomb has been rolled away. And yes, Mary supposes that the man standing outside the tomb is the gardener. She knows on reflection - and in her deepest being, that gardeners take care of things. Indeed, here he is, enfolding her as he says, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking

for? (Jn 20: 15)" And, as the supposed gardener says this, in that very moment, Mary recognizes the voice of her teacher and her friend. In that moment she knows in her deepest heart that her Jesus who was crucified, her "Rabbouni," has risen.

But yes on this Saturday, my laptop has frozen overnight, and needs attention! And with a visit to England planned for tomorrow to attend the funeral of my sister in law's husband, there is no time to get it repaired! And then to find and send Rick the article that I have already written (!) for this year.

May I repeat now what I reflected then: "Ours is an Easter faith, speaking to life being present even in the midst of all situations..." And yes, may I say that even in those days that may feel, in the moment, as crisis laden as those pandemic days, we can know the deepest hope as we believe, indeed as we experience, that somewhere, somehow, the Risen One is calling our name...

Scholarships

he RCCO National Office and the Ottawa Centre have funds available to help members young or old, at any stage of their career, to participate in educational and professional development activities.

Ottawa Centre Scholarships

Anthony King-Douglas Gibson Scholarship and Allen Cureton Scholarship

These scholarships, worth up to \$500 and \$300 respectively, are awarded annually to Ottawa Centre members planning to attend a summer course, conference or other professional development activity. The funds can contribute toward the cost of attending an RCCO convention, but must be applied to an organized course or event; not to be used for private lessons. Deadline for applications is April 30th, 2025, by letter to the Centre President describing vour planned activity, its cost, as well as a brief description of your educational background and proposed professional development activity.

Student Membership Grant

The RCCO Ottawa Centre is pleased to offer a complimentary student membership for any organ student meeting the RCCO requirements:

- The organ student is under 35 years of age
- The organ student meets the National RCCO criteria for Student Membership
- The organ student is a member of the RCCO Ottawa Centre
- The student's teacher is a member of the RCCO
- The organ student may apply for the grant each year that he/she meets the above criteria
- Renewals are subject to the availability of funds

STEP 1: Fill out the Application form on the Ottawa Centre website at rcco-ottawa.ca/pdf/Student%20 Membership%20Grant%20

Application.pdf for the Centre Treasurer to indicate that you qualify for the Membership Grant.

STEP 2: The student should go to the RCCO National Office website at www.rcco.ca to process their membership as a student and pay their membership directly with National Office, selecting the Ottawa Centre as their choice of Centres. The student will then be reimbursed for only their membership fee after the Ottawa Centre receives confirmation of their membership from National Office.



GODFREY HEWITT MEMORIAL FUND

The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of the late Godfrey Hewitt, C.D., D.Mus. (Cantuar), FRCO, Hon. ARSCM. The \$6,000 Scholarship is awarded each spring on the basis of application with letters of recommendation, a recording of requested repertoire, and a study plan for the following year.

Required repertoire for the following spring's competition and other requirements can be found on the Centre website: reco-ottawa.ca/require. All applicants shall satisfy the following requirements:

- proof of Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status in Canada; or, for non-Canadian applicants, proof of having been accepted to study fulltime at a Canadian university in the following academic year;
- RCCO Associate diploma or similar academic level of qualification;
- stated intention of teaching organ (either in an academic institution or privately, not necessarily as the candidate's primary career).

Ottawa Kiwanis Music Festival Organ Scholarship

The Ottawa Centre provides \$500 for organ scholarships through the annual Kiwanis Festival of Music and Dance. These scholarships are awarded by the organ adjudicator.

Student Organ Lessons Bursary

One bursary will be made available each year from the Development Fund to enable an organ student of any age to take a series of organ lessons when in financial need. The lessons are to be given by an RCCO member and the bursary is paid to the teacher upon completion of the lessons. The value of this bursary is the same as for the beginning student scholarship. Contact the **Student Concerns coordinator** before **April 30th**, **2025** to apply.

Examination Preparation Bursary

The Ottawa Centre is offering support for centre members who wish to pursue certification from the RCCO. The Examination Bursary of \$200 is intended to be used by the examination candidate to pay for a small number of lessons from a senior organist familiar with the examination requirements and standards.

The lessons may be on the topics of the candidates choice (repertoire, practical tests, written tests or ear training) and the Centre can provide recommendations on appropriate teachers with experience in standards of performance expected for successfully completing RCCO examinations.

To be awarded an Examination Bursary please contact in confidence the **Education convenor** for the Ottawa Centre. **Applications are typically made in the fall.** Payment will be made to the applicant after confirmation of registration for an examination has been received.

National Office Scholarships

The Lorna and Murray Holmes Scholarship

The Lorna Holmes Scholarship is available annually, and provides \$1,000 to a student entering organ or church music studies at a Canadian University. Preference will be given to students beginning undergraduate studies. Applicants must hold membership in the College. A letter of application must be accompanied by a proof of acceptance at a Canadian university, and two letters of reference from people able to assess the candidate's suitability for the scholarship. Rachel Joy Brownell Memorial Bursary

The purpose of this \$300 travel bursary is to expand the musical horizons of organists from isolated communities by offsetting transportation costs to the annual RCCO National Festival, where no other option would otherwise be available.

Qualifying criteria:

• Current member of the College in good standing.

- Preference will be given to applicants who live over 500 km from site of the festival but those who live closer will be considered.
- May hold Service Playing Certificate or CRCCO, but not Associate, Fellow or other post-secondary diplomas or degrees.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have never before attended an RCCO festival.
- Preference will be given to females over the age of 45, but male and younger candidates will be considered.

The Clifford McAree Scholarship

The scholarship of \$1000 will be awarded annually to allow a student to attend an Organ Festival of the RCCO. This scholarship will give the chosen student a chance to attend workshops, listen to exceptional organ performances, and start the essential process of networking with other organists. It may be used for any expenses associated with attending such an event (e.g. registration fee, transportation, meals, accommodation, etc.)

The applicant must be enrolled in a programme leading to a degree in organ performance. The applicant may reside anywhere in Canada.

The Lilian Forsyth Scholarship

The scholarship of up to \$1500 is presented annually, and aimed at persons pursuing a career in church music or

actively involved in music directly related to the worship of the Christian community. This will include organists, choir directors, composers, and other musicians. It is preferable that such candidates should have completed their basic musical training.

Application deadline is **April 30**th, **2025**.

Sir Ernest Macillan Memorial Foundation Prize

Offered in odd-numbered years, this prestigious prize of \$8000 will support the artistic development and career advancement of a young organist. It may be used to assist with travel, a workshop or study program, participation in a festival or competition, or other relevant purposes.

Candidates should be at an advanced stage of their musical education, under thirty-five years of age at April 30, 2025, and should hold either a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada. They should also be members of the Royal Canadian College of Organists.

Candidates are expected to prepare a program of no more than 40 minutes of music drawn from three categories:

- 1. the works of J. S. Bach: a slow and fast movement from one of Trio Sonatas III, IV, V, or VI
- 2. French symphonic school: two contrasting movements from an organ symphony of Widor or Vierne
- 3. Contemporary Canadian Organ Music drawn from the repertoire list.

The winner will be selected by video recording audition and references, adjudicated by a jury of representatives from the Royal Canadian College of Organists and the wider musical community. The jury may withhold its recommendation if it considers no applicant is of sufficiently high artistic standard.

Application deadline is April 30, 2025.





Godfrey Hewitt Sacred Choral Music

Frances Macdonnell

Frances Macdonnell and Ross Jewell are very happy to announce that after years of work, we and an advisory group have published a book containing all of the Sacred Choral Music composed and performed by Dr. Godfrey Hewitt at Christ Church Cathedral, Ottawa.

This publication includes all his choral music for the Eucharist and for Matins and Evensong, his original Psalm chants, and an Introit, but also, and most notably, it publishes for the first time his wonderful reharmonizations of hymntunes! All his working life, Godfrey played his own reharmonizations of the final verses of hymns, sometimes in two different arrangements for two different times of the year - but he never wrote them down! And yet I have never heard finer ones: their movement and harmonic development always illustrate the mood and meaning of the words better than any other.

Some of you will still remember Godfrey playing them. And I, having grown up around the Cathedral, and being Godfrey's organ student, and then his Assistant for his last five years at the Cathedral, listened to these reharmonizations all my life, and I remembered them perfectly, because I have a "harmonic memory". And then, of course, I continued to play them myself, from my memory, for all the years after I succeeded Godfrey at the Cathedral; I still play them.

Just after Easter 2023, I was playing the reharmonization to the final verse of Ye choirs of new Jerusalem at our monthly Anglican Eucharist in St.

Vincent's Hospital Chapel, and Ross Jewell, who sings in our choir there, commented, "How sad it is that no other organists can play Godfrey's wonderful reharmonizations, as he never wrote them down."

Whereupon I recklessly said, "Well, I could write them down out of my memory, if you would engrave them into permanent form!" - you know, of course, that Ross is the official music engraver

for all the National RCCO's Choral Music Publications.

So that's what we set out to do, and to make sure we hadn't forgotten anything, we formed an Advisory Committee of eight people, all of whom had sung in Godfrey's choirs at some point between 1953 and 1980, and we produced, from my memory and Ross's professional engraving, all these reharmonizations. Then we thought that if we were going to publish them, we should add the service music which Godfrey had written and which survived only in xerox copies of his own handwriting (which was only legible to those choir members who already knew how to read it!) Ross has engraved all these service settings, responses, psalm chants, and so on, and they make up the second half of the Book.

There is a full academic Preface to the Book, written by Dr. John Brough. Many of you will remember John Brough (now living in Edmonton though his father, Jim Brough, is a long-time member of this Centre). John never actually sang under Godfrey as he joined the Cathedral Choir in 1980 as an eight-year-old choirboy, but he then grew up in the Cathedral atmosphere which was still imbued with Godfrey's strength of musical personality. Then when John did his DMA at the University of Alberta with Marnie Giesbrecht, his doctoral thesis was written on the history of church music at Christ Church Cathedral, Ottawa. So who better for us to ask to write the Preface than John Brough! - it's fascinating to read!

The new Book comes with wire-o binding so that it will lie open easily on the console, and the paper is heavier than regular bond so that there is no danger of the pages blowing over in a breeze from an overhead fan.

If you buy a copy of this Book, and decide you want your choir to sing one of the works - Psalm 118 on Easter Day, perhaps, or one of the Canticles - the copyright allows you to then make copies of that one piece for your choir.

As you will see in the poster, the Book also contains a full-size photograph of Godfrey seated at the Cathedral's Casavant organ console. It was taken by Malak Karsh in 1947, and shows him much as I remember him when I was a child

The publication of this Book has been undertaken with the help of the Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Fund which I established after Godfrey's death in 2002. As you know, the Fund does a great deal of work to help produce the Organ Teachers Canada needs for the future. It provides

- an annual Scholarship of \$6,000 for a graduate student in organ
- the bi-annual Grand Prize of \$6,000 for the RCCO National Organ-Playing Competition
- the bi-annual Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Recital at the RCCO Organ Festival
- an annual grant of \$3,000 to the RCCO's Summer Student Academy
- an annual grant of \$2,500 to Pro Organo and other concert series in Canada, when they present a laureate of either the Scholarship or the Prize.

And now the Fund has guaranteed the publication of this book of all Godfrey's Sacred Choral Music. I never knew any other organist in the world to play the service music of the Church as effectively as Godfrey Hewitt, and I am so grateful to all involved, especially Ross Jewell, that we have been able now to publish Godfrey's own music for the first time.

I will have copies available for sale at \$30 at the upcoming Pro Organo concerts and other Centre events. Please see the attached poster for details.


